Single Touch Payroll starts from 1 July 2018

We are changing the way employers report tax and super information to us. You need to use Single Touch Payroll from 1 July 2018.

As you have 20 or more employees, you need to start using Single Touch Payroll-enabled software to report your:

- › payments to employees such as salary and wages
- › pay as you go (PAYG) withholding
- › super information.

You need to send us this information at the same time as you pay your employees.

You can also get a third-party provider – like a tax professional or payroll service provider – to report to us through Single Touch Payroll on your behalf.

Payroll and service providers are updating their products and services. They'll let you know when they become Single Touch Payroll-enabled.
